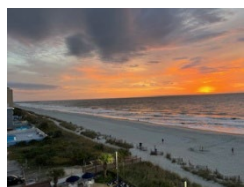

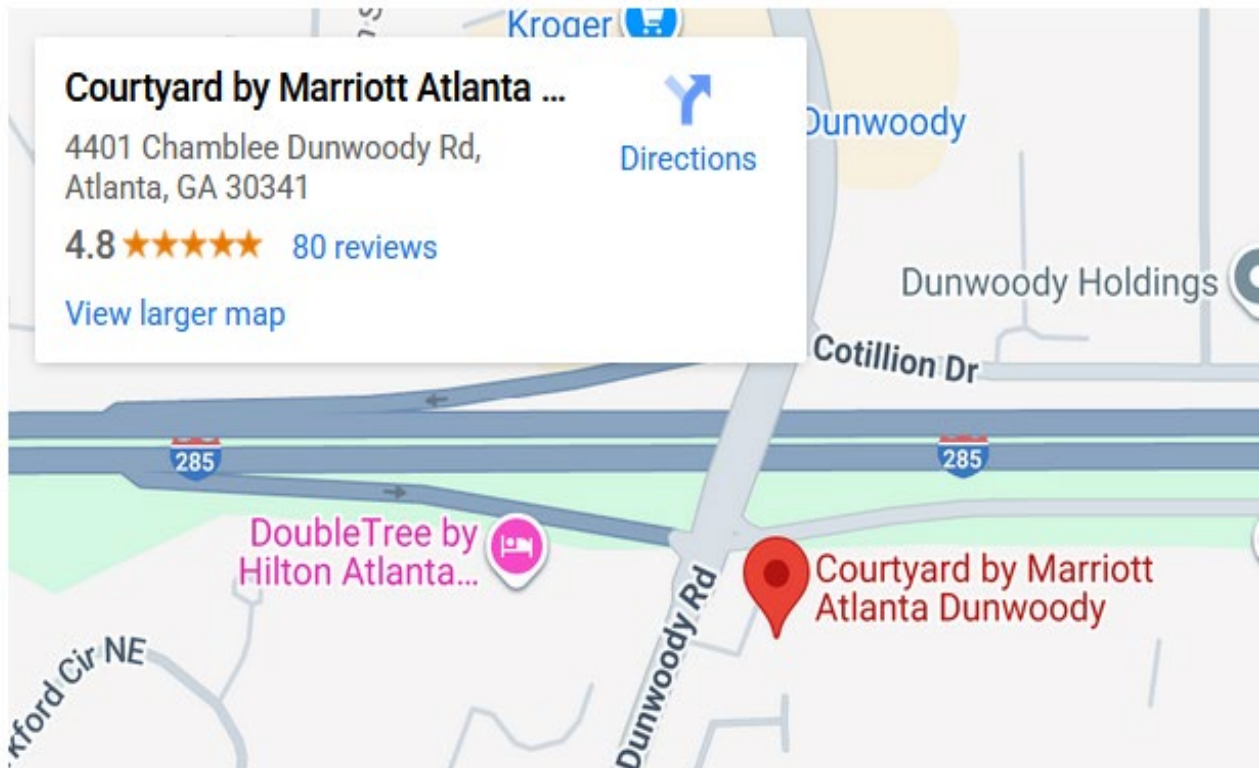

I’m not great at waiting.... Call me.

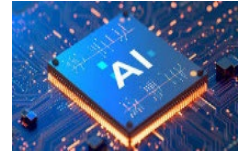

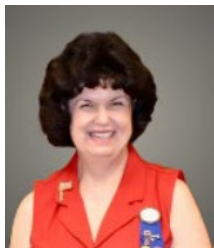

Pour batter into 2 greased loaf pans

(Optional: lightly sprinkle top with sugar and cinnamon)

Bake at 325 degrees for 35-45 minutes.

Each year one ornament is selected to be on my tree. Since the ornaments are so fragile, they are placed each year in a container to be seen by family and friends.

By the way, when cleaning out my family home in Mississippi, some of that tinsel that was returned, string by string, by my mother to its original box is now part of my decorated tree. Yes, I return the tinsel each year to its original box.



Food was different in my home, as my family hailed from Newfoundland...stuffing was the high light of the meal. Mama's stuffing recipe is still used in my home. My siblings and I were perhaps the only children at school that did not know cornbread dressing. We stuffed that bird on Christmas Eve and it was placed in the oven after we all returned from Midnight Mass at 1:30-2:00 am. Then, music, food, drinks and fun with friends and family. Bed time...who cared...it was Christmas Day and the celebration of our Lord's Birth. We partied on "Harvey Hill" and everyone in the community knew when to be there. Life was good then and Christmas memories abound.

Georgia Gold Mine Attraction

The Alpha Beta Chapter took a little field trip recently to the Pine Mountain Gold Museum in Villa Rica, GA. The mining camp was established in 1826 and is Georgia's only gold museum, situated on the site of an actual gold strike and West Georgia's only authentic 19th century gold stamp mill. Georgia's first historian tells of a discovery in Carroll County near present day Villa Rica in 1826 but did not list his sources. The Villa Rica claim was not widely recognized and remained conjecture and folklore for 175 years. Dahlonega played host to the first widely publicized gold rush in the state in 1829.



According to ground surveys taken in the mid 1820's, gold was discovered in the northern parts of Carroll County near present day Villa Rica. This region was included in the Dahlonega Gold Belt. Throughout the mid 1800's the Dahlonega Gold Belt was one of the richest gold formations ever found in the continental United States.

As the gold diminished, the miners moved northward to the Cherokee Indian territory. This discovery of gold was the driving force for the removal of the Native Americans in this area. Nineteen commercial gold mining operations were recorded in and around Villa Rica, but only the Pine Mountain Gold Mine was commercially mined after 1900.

Unfortunately for us, the museum was closed and will be closed until March 2026 for renovations, but the outside exhibits were great, and we walked along the paths for up close and personal looks at some of the equipment that was used when the mine was operational. After it reopens in the spring, visitors can actually pan for gold for a small fee. A train ride is available, and has special events (i.e., ride the Ghost Train every Thursday through Saturday in October, Winter Wonderland every Thursday through Saturday in December) and others which are listed on their website: villa.rica.org/pine-mountain-gold-museum/special-events.

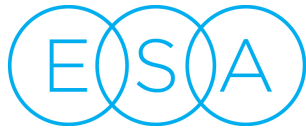
