storytelling basics (for example, a better way to explain an ESA event: have a beginning-why did you have any event?, middle-what happened at the event?, and end-what was the result?), (3) defining the purpose of YOUR story (find your story and make sure its relevant to who you are sharing it with), (4) helping others share their message, (5) various types of software you can utilize for scheduling, making a digital business card. Some types of software that were shared: Rocketbook, Canva, Dropbox (scheduling, etc.) and HiHello.me (to create a digital business card).

Beth Perkins with ALSAC/St. Jude spoke to us about the importance of getting registered at <u>volunteer.stjude.org</u> so that VMS can track our hours. Remember that each volunteer hour is worth \$29.00. She also told us that since the pandemic, ALSAC's group of field people been reduced by 65. Therefore, she asked that we all show grace when trying to communicate with them with our local ALSAC office.

During the Mid-Year Meeting, I sold Hearts for Heart Month to benefit the Disaster Fund. Members bought Hearts for that special someone in their Life for a


minimum of \$1.00 per heart. Below are pictures of the Hearts by Chapter.
