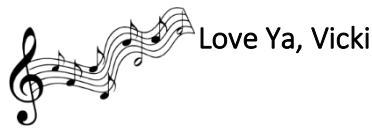
Vicki Warren, Jr Past President

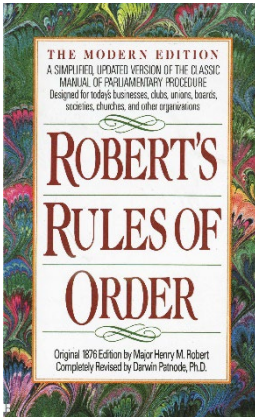
2023 GSC CONVENTION FUND-RAISER "CHRISTMAS EXTRAVAGANZA"

Hope for Heroes Memorial Day Report

Memorial Day is traditionally a day we remember and honor our loved ones, friends, and total strangers for their service and for giving their lives to make and keep America free. It is a somber day filled with memories and tributes made to those that gave their all for our country.

Two of our Georgia ESA chapters, Alpha Beta & Kappa Rho, demonstrated their admiration and thankfulness for fallen heroes in Georgia by placing flags on the graves of our soldiers in the Pooler/Savannah area and in the Villa Rica area.

Kappa Rho has collected Troopons and stamps during April, May & June for our Military.

On May 15th, we helped post 26,000 “Flags for the Fallen” Memorial Day Event at the National Museum of the Mighty Eighth Air Force in Pooler. The flags were the 48-Star

Flags that our Fallen Heroes had served under during World War II. During the posting of the flags, Roll Call for all 26,000 Fallen Eagles were heard by all and the Roll Call continued throughout the 5-day event. On May 31, they returned to help remove the 26,000 flags. In our Sister’s words, “What an Honor it was for Kappa Rho to be a part of such a special event for our Fallen Heroes.”

Alpha Beta has also collected stamps during April, May & June for our Military wounded soldiers. They are used for therapy purposes for those who suffer fine muscle motor skills issues. On May 28th, we visited a Confederate Soldier’s Cemetery in Villa Rica. We placed flags on the Confederate Soldier’s graves. Some were marked with tombstones, many were not identified at all but had a very decayed stone or rock identifying it as a grave, but no names or dates of death. The Cemetery was established in 1835.
